Coronavirus Contingency: planning for impact

Dear Parents and Carers

As the country moves into another period of lockdown and as Doncaster records some of the highest infection rates in the region, and indeed the country, we want to share with you our detailed contingency plans for various scenarios. Our hope in sharing these plans is that you fully understand that we will do all that we can to keep our students and staff safe, whilst at the same time continuing to provide students with valuable education. I hope that sharing these plans in advance can also help you in your own scenario planning.

COMMUNICATION

When there are changes to levels, school will inform parents and carers immediately via schoolcomms reinforced by messages on the school website, Facebook and Twitter.

We are currently at Level 2a. Official school decisions will only come from these sources, so please make sure you check them regularly. Please use our usual channels should you wish to raise a query. The school website has a comprehensive list of contacts.

Given that decisions may be announced at very short notice, we advise parents to have contingencies in place for the collection of children from school or alternatively, for students to get home and inside safely.

On behalf of all the staff and Governors I would like to thank you for your patience, understanding, good wishes and prayers.

INFORM SCHOOL OF A POSITIVE TEST

If your child is tested positive for COVID-19 contact the school as soon as you know using the email address cv@mcauley.org.uk.

You should provide the following;
Name of student and date of birth
Year group and form
Contact phone number
Date last in school
Date of start of symptoms
Date of test

You will be telephoned the same day asking for names of close contacts with your child.

This document gives parents/carers some idea of what they can expect so that they too can plan for the possible increasing impact of the virus over the next few months. Please note that the higher the LEVEL, the more students are affected and the greater the need for remote learning.

groups. This has been decided because staff absence means that the safe running of the whole school is compromised.

We'll move to a **rota model**, combining onsite provision with <u>remote learning</u>.

Y11, 12 and Y13 will remain in school full time.

Y7 and Y8 will alternate; one week in and one week out based on the Cantley site.

Y9 and Y10 will alternate one week in; one week out based on the Acacia site.

The start date for each to be determined and dependent on circumstances.

We'll continue to maintain:

- 'Bubbles' of pupils don't mix with other rota groups
- We'll include vulnerable pupils and the children of critical workers in rota groups, even if they will be at school fulltime

We'll maintain the same rules on face coverings as in level 1

We'll update our risk assessment to reflect our rota model, and we'll communicate our plans with all staff and parents.

Vulnerable pupils - In the event of a rota model We'll strongly encourage vulnerable pupils to continue attending school. To do this, we'll:

- Contact a student's parent or carer, and (where applicable) social worker if the pupil doesn't attend, to find out why and discuss their concerns
- Work with our local authority (LA)

If vulnerable students are part of the selfisolating Year Group bubble they will not be expected to attend.

Absence requests Vulnerable students: we'll **only** grant absence requests for parents who want their child to be absent during their rota group's scheduled time at home. All pupils should attend school when their rota group is scheduled to be on-site.

Remote Education plans can be accessed on the school website under 'Remote Learning - Covid 19 Provision'. The existing curriculum scheme of work will continue to be followed and will dovetail on return to full teaching. Students not in school will be expected to follow their normal school timetable but this may not be the equivalent of 5 hours per day.

Free school meals We will work with ASPENS to prepare meals or food parcels for all pupils eligible for free schools meals, whether they are at home or on-site. Vouchers may be purchased.

Staffing arrangements Staff will be expected to attend every day and be required to cover for absent colleagues where necessary.



LEVEL 3

Parents/carers continue to notify school of positive case via cv@mcauley.org.uk

STATUS Fully open for Years 11, 12 and 13 with REMOTE LEARNING for all other year groups (no rota).

This has been decided because staff absence levels means that the safe running of the whole school is compromised. We'll also remain open full-time for vulnerable pupils and the children of critical workers.

We'll provide remote education for all other students.

We'll maintain the same rules on face coverings on-site as in level 1

Remote Education plans can be accessed on the school website under 'Remote Learning - Covid 19 Provision'. The existing curriculum scheme of work will continue to be followed and will dovetail on return to full teaching. Students not in school will be expected to follow their normal school timetable but this may not be the equivalent of 5 hours per day.

Vulnerable pupils - We'll strongly encourage vulnerable pupils to continue attending school. To do this, we'll:

- Contact a student's parent or carer, and (where applicable) social worker if the pupil doesn't attend, to find out why and discuss their concerns
